

Chairman's Report: 2013 – 2014

My year as Chairman of Tattershall with Thorpe Parish Council appears to have passed extremely quickly. Although as a council we have been busy on one major project. The council has completed the purchase of a large piece/area of land at Clinton Park and we will now be considering ways in which it can be used in the future

for the benefit of all residents. We have also secured the ownership of the War Memorial in Tattershall Thorpe.

As usual there have been a number of changes caused by the resignation of three councillors for personal reasons and the appointment of new councillors in their place. I would like to thank all the councillors for their hard work throughout the last year.

May 2013 saw changes brought about by the election of new councillors at both County and District levels. The parish council is grateful to County Councillor Mair and District Councillors Avison and Pears for their regular attendance at, and input to, parish council meetings.

As in previous years annual trophies have been presented. The Manning Trophy was awarded to Mr. Mike Hodgson from Thorpe Camp for his work developing Thorpe Camp as a visitor attraction.

Along with other members of the local area I was privileged to attend the Commanding Officer's annual reception at RAF Coningsby. The evening was warm both in terms of the weather and the hospitality we received and proved to be a highlight of my year of office.

Moving forward to the end of the year, the village was spared from the effects of inclement weather conditions experienced elsewhere in the country. Indeed, the snow gritting machine, which the parish council bought the previous year, was treated to an unusually long period of hibernation. The annual Christmas tree lighting ceremony was again joined by the RAF Coningsby Military Wives Choir, who sang for us in the church, as did the Brownies.

One of the most significant matters of the year is the uncertainty of the future of the community library. Tattershall with Thorpe Parish Council and Coningsby Town Council continue to work together to present a united harmonised front to try and establish the long-term viability of the facility and the community access point.

Finally, as my year of office comes to an end, I would like to thank all those who have helped to make the year so enjoyable.

REPORT FROM TATTERSHALL THORPE RESIDENTS

The Annual Parish Meeting at Thorpe Camp was very well attended, and was followed by an illustrated talk by Mike Hodgson on the 'Dambusters Raid'. Mike had been awarded the Manning Trophy this year for the work he and others had put into promoting Thorpe Camp as a visitor attraction.

The Thorpe War Memorial has finally passed into Parish Council ownership. It has always been maintained by the Parish Council, although it was on the 'deeds' of the Methodist Chapel.

Mandy Jagger was awarded the 'Bluebell Trophy' for the Best Kept Garden in 2013. The garden has been created from a wilderness to its present state in just two years.

Our annual 'meet the neighbours' took place in September and we had a collection of old photos and documents relating to the village to browse. Many of which had been the property of the late Mr. John Porter.

Remembrance Day was again well supported at our War Memorial. This year an extra wreath was laid from 'The Residents of Thorpe'.

The County Council have constructed a vehicle passing place adjacent to The Old Chapel in Chapel Lane in order to allow vehicles entering the lane a refuge, whilst oncoming traffic exits. The Parish Council contributed £1250 towards the cost of the works.

Whilst many villages are losing their libraries, the mobile library visiting Thorpe will continue for the foreseeable future as the service was deemed to be well used. It is hoped that the village will continue to support this valuable service.
